International inspiration: Access insights and strategies from diverse educational systems across Europe, enriching your approach and broadening your vision.

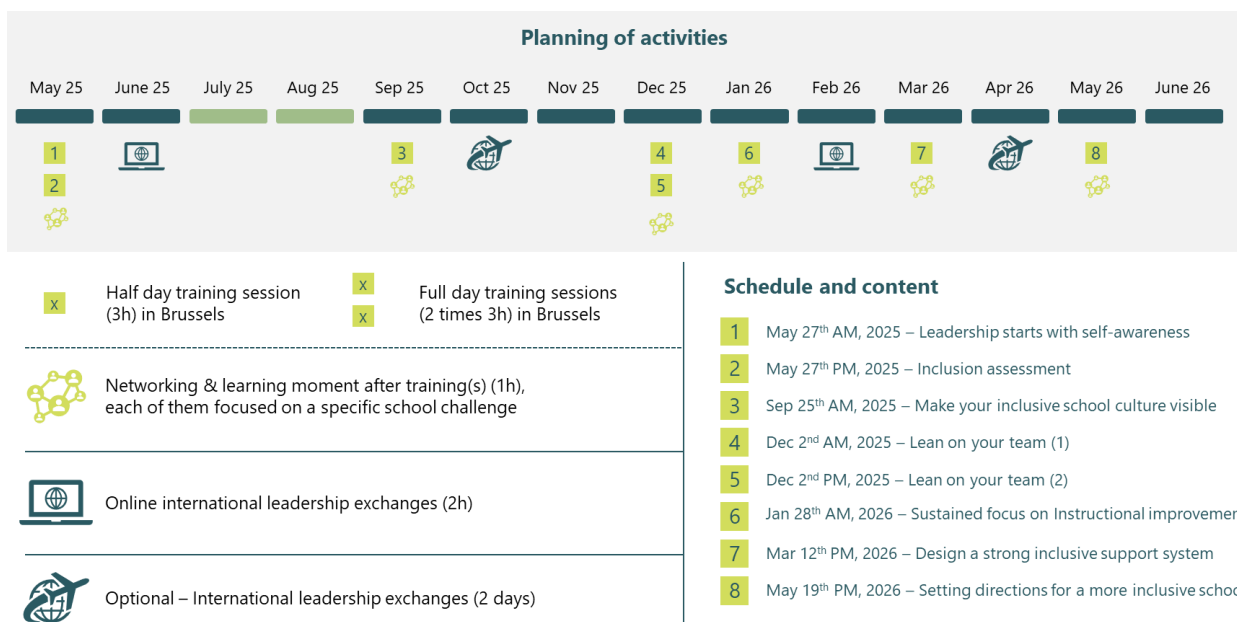

THE PROGRAMME IN A NUTSHELL

Leadership Empowerment and Development for Inclusive education in Europe (LEAD-IN)

LEAD-IN is our pioneering program supported by Erasmus+, bringing together partners from the 'Teach for-' organizations in Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria and Poland, and Karel de Grote Hogeschool in Belgium as a research partner. The project spans two academic years (2024-2026) and aims to empower school leaders to guide and support their school teams towards ownership of an inclusive culture. Commitment and Eligibility

- Team Participation: You and a colleague from your school, both holding (or soon to hold) leadership roles, must join. It is relevant to have 2 persons of your leadership team as it will enable you to share insights and strengthen the impact in the school.
- Full Engagement: A commitment to the entire program is key for a significant and impactful experience and lasting results – the sessions are not independent from one another. The two international exchanges which you will be able to subscribe for are optional and are financed by Erasmus+.
- Out-of-school: All national training sessions will take place in Brussels in NL and FR (two groups)
- Participation cost: The program is free for its participants, as it is co-funded by Erasmus+, only transportation costs to and from Brussels are financed by the participants.
